WRABNESS PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 20th February 2019 in Wrabness Village Hall at 7.30pm

2713: Declaration of interests: None

2714: Public Forum:

- 1: 1 member of public raised concerns about the pavement along Rectory Road: Mr M Cole responded: This has been chased recently, still waiting for a response from Highways.
- 2: District Councillor Zoe Fairley spoke about concerns on how Essex Highways deal with highways issues, she will continue to push for these issues to be dealt with more effectively in the future. Mr M Cole also highlighted his concerns with Essex Highways and has reported many issues regarding poor maintenance of the roads in the rural areas and will continue to highlight the problems. Councillor Zoe Fairley would like to work with the Parish Council regarding the better maintenance of roads in rural areas.

Mr R Colley asked Councillor Zoe Fairley about the change in the weekly household refuse collection service starting from June 2019. Councillor Zoe Fairley will send some information to the Parish Clerk about the changes.

2717: Playing Field:

1: Anti – Social behaviour:

The Parish Council contacted our District Councillor for advice. This was then passed onto Tendring District Council Planning with a request for an Informal Site Review from our District Councillor.

TDC Planning were unable to help and suggested the Parish Council contact Anti-Social Behaviour Team at TDC who referred the case to the Leadership Support & Community Team at TDC. The site review was rejected and the response from TDC was: 'If you live next to a playing field expect some noise.'

The Parish Council agreed to Code of Conduct signage on the entrance to the Playing Field, the wording for the Code of Conduct has been approved and signage has been ordered. The Parish Council hopes this will reduce the problem as all other avenues that are practical have been exhausted.

Councillor Zoe Fairley has requested an informal site review from TDC, will also contact the Community Officers. Councillor Zoe Fairley will keep the Parish Clerk updated. **Action: Councillor Zoe Fairley/Parish Clerk.**

2: Pinging Noise from safety fence/climbing into gardens to retrieve footballs.

The Parish Council contacted Tendring District Council Leisure Services and The Environmental Health Team. Both departments said such noise should be expected living next to a playing field. The Environmental Health Team said they usually have complaints about football games being played in the street and balls being kicked into gardens. Safety fences are used in play areas to help prevent balls straying into gardens.

After extensive research from the Parish Council and Wrabness Playing Field Committee it was arranged to fit rubber grommets along the main part of the fence to help reduce the noise. The grommets were fitted last summer and have helped to reduce the pinging sound from footballs being kicked against the fence. The Parish Council and Wrabness Playing Field Committee will monitor and tighten the grommets as needed.

3: Climbing into gardens to retrieve footballs. The Parish Council and Wrabness Playing Field Committee have put up, DO NOT CLIMB signs and painted Anti-climb paint to the fencing backing onto gardens. Paint will be reapplied by the Parish Council and Wrabness Playing Committee as needed.

4: Netting Goal: The Parish Council contacted Tendring District Council about putting up a second goal net. They have not been able to advise the Parish Council. After further research it was agreed not to put up a second netting as this could be a safety issue and create further noise.

No further action.

5: Wire fencing ripped; This has been inspected by the Parish Council and Wrabness Playing Field Committee and been repaired. **No Further Action.**

2718: Local Service Funds: Pre-application deadline 14th March. — Suggested the Parish Council apply for a yearly grant towards the cost of the maintenance of Wrabness Playing Field. All Agreed: Action: **Parish Clerk**

2719: Wrabness Community Grant application:

1: Wrabness Playing Field Association has requested a grant of £37.00 for the Village Hall hire to hold a fundraising jumble sale on: 23rd March. All proceeds raised from the jumble sale would go towards the upkeep of the playing fields. All were agreed.

2720: Wrabness Parish Council website: Mr R Colley gave a report: The Parish Council Website at: www.essexinfo.net/wrabness-parish-council was launched in November 2013.

The web site is based on free technology sponsored by Essex County Council for community organisations from Cambridge Open Systems. The web site is provided by a Parish Councillor at no cost to the community. The site provides public information about the Parish Council, local community facilities and services. It currently comprises 23 pages of information, plus links to background documents, hotlinks to external web sites and Facebook pages of specific relevance to Wrabness.

Web pages are updated as Wrabness news becomes available either from Parish Council sources, other organisations or from secondary sources. The Weather and Tides page automatically updates utilising Met Office widgets. The hot links to other web sites such as train and bus information, refuse collections and disposal sites ensure readers can view the latest on-line information from other service providers. The site contains an archive of Parish Council Minutes for the past five years.

Since the web site launch in November 2013 the number of visits by users has grown. During 2018 a total of 6,895 visits were made to the website, a marginal increase compared with the previous year.

Whilst most users access the web site directly, some find it via a specific phrase or word search on Google, Yahoo or similar search engine. Some users access the web site via hot links from other websites and Facebook pages. Village facilities continue to benefit from the free publicity of the Parish Council website. There is scope to add information relevant to Wrabness as it becomes available. If any of our community groups wish to have more exposure on the website – they just have to ask and provide the information.
